



FOOD BANK OF SLO COUNTY

Expansion of Children's Farmer's Market into 9 new sites per month (doubling the amount of sites countywide) 30 to 150 children served at each site each taking home upwards of 15 pounds of fresh produce; much of it gleaned right from our region. A total of 170,385 pounds of produce went home with kids this past school year.
