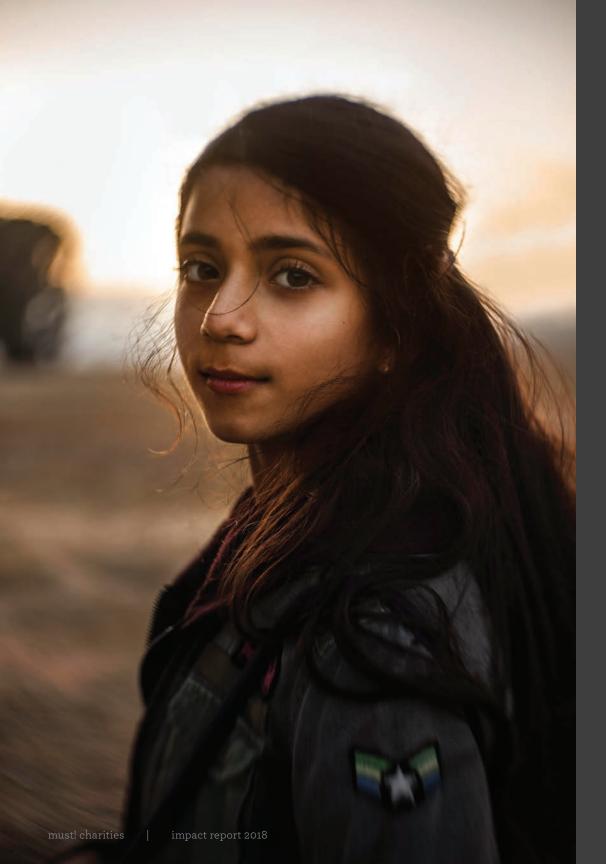

Over the past seven years we have raised over \$3 million with over \$2 million of that coming from community members like you. 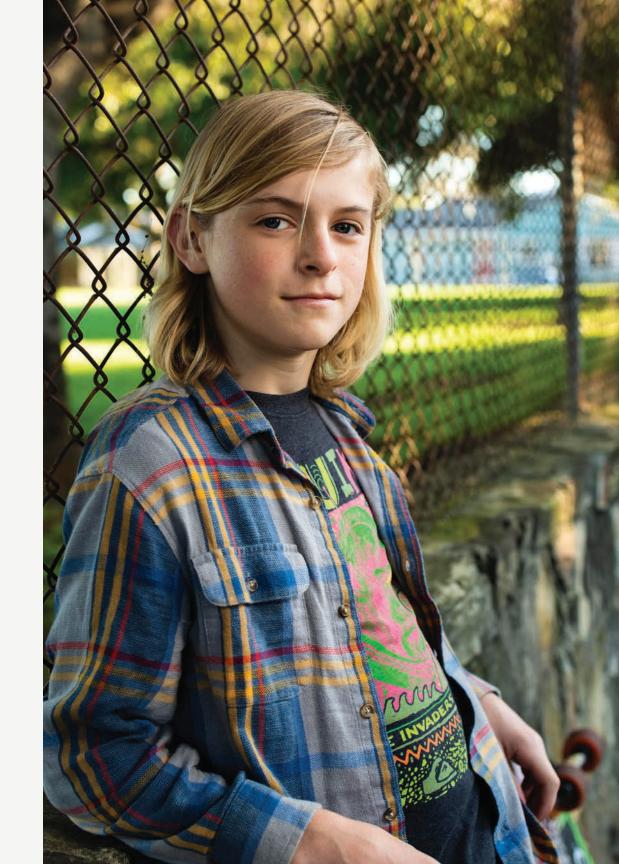
must! began this journey knowing we wanted to positively impact lives and give hope to those in need. At the time, we didn't know the lives we would help impact. Data showed the need to provide more safe after-school programs for kids in our community. In 2012 we made a multi-year investment expanding the Boys and Girls Club in order to serve more kids in need. Kids like Jayden. At eleven years old, The Boys and Girls Club is helping him navigate challenges.

When Jayden started at the Boys and Girls Club, he was often misbehaving and distracting others. At the Club, staff was very in-tune to this, and reached out to his family. Jayden's life had recently turned upside down. He lived mostly with his mom and only recently moved in with his dad. That resulted in a change of houses, change of schools, and according to his dad he "no longer had a mom." All these life changes were hard for Jayden. How can we expect an eleven year old to communicate that to us?

When a child's family life is unstable, it is a big deal — a VERY big deal — that often ends up manifesting in negative outbursts and misbehavior. In fact, most kids these days are not misbehaving because they want to. It usually stems from something else going on in their lives. The more we learn about the effects of trauma on our youth, the more we understand.

The Club embraced Jayden and implemented coping strategies that kept him safe. They also increased his mentor time which made him feel more secure. The results: Jayden feels safe at the Club, and has grown leaps and bounds. This is just one life positively impacted from your investment in must! charities.
